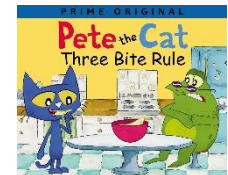
Kindergarten-2nd Grade

- **[JFIC ANG] Fuzzy by Angleberger, Dellinger.** When Max (Maxine Zealster) befriends her new robot classmate Fuzzy, she helps him navigate Vanguard Middle School and together they reveal the truth behind the Robot Integration Program.
- **[JFIC APP] Wishtree by Applegate, Katherine.** An old red oak tree tells how he and his crow friend, Bongo, help their human neighbors get along after a threat against an immigrant family is carved into the tree's trunk.
- **[JFIC BEA] Lions and Liars by Beasley, Kate.** Fifth-grader Frederick is sent to a disciplinary camp where he and his terrifying troop mates have just started forging a friendship when they learn a Category 5 hurricane is headed their way.

Non-Fiction

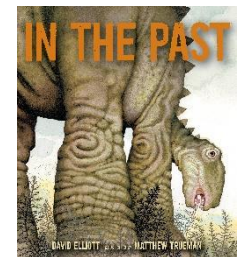
- **[J573.88] Eye Spy: Wild Ways Animals See the World by Duprat, Guillaume.** This book shares the latest scientific research on animal vision. Discover pigeons' sunglasses, owls' tube-shaped eyes, insects with thousands of mini eyes, and much, much more. With delightful and surprising illustrations, this book allows us a rare glimpse of the world through animals' eyes. Learn interesting facts such as: cows spot predators coming up from behind, cats see mice scurrying through the night, snakes see infrared-- which we only feel as heat, and eagles see eight times more detail than we can.
- **[J591.5] How to Swallow A Pig by Jenkins, Steve.** A clever and whimsical nonfiction book about animal behavior disguised as a How-to/Advice book.
- **[J591.5] What Do They Do With All That Poo? by Kurtz, Jane.** An exploration of different types of animal poo and what the zoo uses it for.
- **[J599.635] Hippos Are Huge! By London, Jonathan.** What's the deadliest animal in Africa? It's not the lion or the crocodile--it's the hippopotamus! Hippos have razor-sharp tusks, weigh as much as fifty men, and can run twenty-five miles per hour! Follow these hefty hulks as they glide underwater, play tug-of-war, swat balls of dung at one another, and nuzzle their young in the mud. Just don't get too close--they could chomp you in two!
- **[J611.0187] You Wouldn't Want to Live Without Boogers! by Woolf, Alex.** Besides being gross, what is the point of boogers and mucus? Read all about how these slimy substances help us digest our food and prevent us from becoming sick. 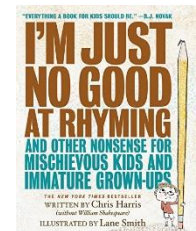

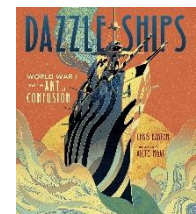

- **[JB Braille] Six Dots by Bryant, Jen.** Louis Braille was just five years old when he lost his sight. He was a clever boy, determined to live like everyone else, and what he wanted more than anything was to be able to read. Even at the school for the blind in Paris, there were no books for him. And so he invented his own alphabet--a whole new system for writing that could be read by touch. A system so ingenious that it is still used by the blind community today.
